Professional home healthcare includes a wide range of skilled medical and support services in the home, usually under a doctor's orders. This translates to people-centered service to support an independent life.

Contents of Visiting Nurse

- Assessment of medical condition (stability, vital signs, preventive intervention)
- Physical support (bathing or shampooing depending on the condition, excretion assistance with self-care, nutritional advice)
- Medicine management (support adherence, assessment of drug action and its side effects)
- Medical equipment management (respirator, oxygen concentrator, infusion pump)
- Specialized care (infusion therapy, use of feeding tubes, insulin injection)
- Wound care for bed sores or chronic wound (prevention and infection control)
- Behavioral and mental health counseling (support caregivers who have concerns regarding cognitive impairment and behavioral health needs)
- Supportive care for terminally ill individuals and his/her family (palliative interventions such as pain management, consultation)
- Rehabilitation therapy (bedridden or contracture prevention, functional recovery, swallowing function training)

Occupations That Can Provide Support at Home from Visiting Nurse Stations

Registered nurse, Assistant nurse, Public health nurse, Midwife, Physical therapist, Occupational therapist, Speech-language-hearing therapist
